Dues

- o Based on the dues amounts for other NCTE constituent organizations, the CCU proposes a base membership dues amount in the range \$10 - \$15.
- o This amount would include voting membership in the CCU, and a subscription to TETYC.
- o Recommend at the same time, developing a membership package (Ex: "College Comprehensive Membership"), (Working with the NCTE's College Section and CCCC) targeted to potential CCU members. This package could separate membership and journal subscriptions. The arrangement could be viewed as an "Incentive Package" -- with each additional service/journal, you pay a little less than full price.

The broad objective of _____ is to unite English teachers of the first two college years in an organization which (1) recognizes and addresses the particular needs of the two-year colleges; (2) privileges conversations about the issues for this level of instruction, and (3) seeks to influence the future of English studies.

Differences Between NTCC - CCU

1. Creates a specific body for membership for national 2-year college English professionals
2. Removes the "phantom" quality of NTCC
3. Creates a "national" forum for 2-year concerns
4. Makes a more visible presence through an official journal - "CCU to You" in TETYC
5. Connects 4C's and regionals through interlocking representation, regional workshops and speakers bureau
6. Provides for a broader representation of various constitutencies on governing board: 6 regionals, ECCTYC, non-regional affiliated 2-year instructors, college-university people who have interest in first 2 years of college sequence
7. Provides a national newsletter (apart from TETYC)
8. Computer listing of job vacancies
