SUBJECT: Report on *TETYC*

The first issue of *TETYC* under new editor Mark Reynolds appeared in October. As is customary NCTE policy, when a new editor assumes responsibility, a new cover is appropriate. The new design retains major focus on the letters which have become synonymous with the journal's title but provides a new logo design with a standard white cover as background. Colors in the logo will continue to change to reflect the seasons. Minor interior design changes also occur in the journal. For the first time, the journal has perfect binding, with the title and publication information on the spine.

The *TETYC* office has processed 179 submissions since assuming responsibility for the journal. Submissions continue to reflect authors from both two- and four-year institutions, with the majority coming from two-year colleges. The acceptance rate to date is 30 percent.

There was some inconsistency in the terms of editorial board members when the editorship changed. In order to have the terms of all board members and consulting readers coincide with the editor's term, I re-appointed all who wished to continue reading submissions to two-year terms and appointed some additional consulting readers. Overall, the review process has gone smoothly, and authors are generally getting reports on their submissions in under two months. A few exceptions may have occurred during the summer months when reviewers were away from campus for extended periods and failed to notify the journal office. Reviewers continue to do excellent work and are to be commended for giving of their time.

We continue to get good material. We continue to need and seek good submissions. I welcome comments about any facets of the journal.

I am pleased to report that the Best Article of the Year Award will continue to be awarded and that Nell Ann Pickett, immediate past editor, will continue to provide a monetary award to the winner.

Two-Year College English Association, Southwest,
Southwest Regional Conference on English in the Two-Year
College, TYCA, Southwest/SRCE

Submitted to the National Two-Year College Council (NTCC)/Two-Year
College English Association (TYCA) by Dennis P. Kriewald

The Southwest regional continues to grow and to show vigor and strength in serving the more than 1,500 full-time teachers of English in the two-year colleges of its six-state region--Arkansas, Colorado, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas--as well as two two-year-college instructors from Kansas who join our regional every year. Of the 1,500 eligible to join, approximately 200 (less than 13%) have paid their \$10 dues for 1994-95, and that number has been holding steady for about the past four or five years.

Last October 13-15, SRCE/TYCA, Southwest held its annual meeting at Laredo, Texas, with the host institution being Laredo Community College and the convention's theme being Diversity and Unity: Culture and Community. About 175 participants had the opportunity to attend a variety of 35 scheduled presentations and workshops; all six states of our region were represented by speakers.

Dr. William Bedford Clark, Professor of English at Texas A & M University, College Station, delivered the Friday, October 14, keynote speech, "Like Death and Dying: The Humanities in a Technetronic Age," and Professor Clark teamed up with his A & M colleague, Dr. Clinton J. Machann, at lunch; Dr. Clark spoke on "Katherine Anne Porter in Texas" while Dr. Machann spoke on "Katherine Anne Porter in Mexico." The Saturday, October 15, breakfast speech, "Diversity and Unity: Assets in Public Service," was given by Texas State Senator Judith L. Zaffirini.

During the convention, two very significant awards were presented: First, the Bob Wylie Service Award was given to Lucy Gonzales, long-time officer and committee chair for SRCE and English instructor from Del Mar College, Corpus Christi, Texas, and second, the SRCE Excellence in Teaching English Award recipient was Anne Younglove, Houston Community College--Central, Houston, Texas.

Mike Cooper of Westark Community College, Fort Smith, Arkansas, contributes outstanding unity and service to the profession and to the regional with his twice-annual SRCE Newsletter, and Dale Adams of Lee College, Baytown, Texas, saw to the publication of the biennial SRCE Directory, copies of which were sent to all the two-year college English instructors in the six states of the regional. And SRCE's liaison with NCTE and CCCC, Professor William E. Tanner of Texas Woman's University, Denton, Texas, completed his five-year term of office. In recognition of this completion and of Professor Tanner's having been a "founding father of SRCE" 30-odd years ago, I presented him a plaque at the Friday morning business session.

To replace Bill Tanner, the Executive Committee nominated Professor Eileen Lundy, the University of Texas at San Antonio, and she has accepted. Her appointment will become effective with the approval of the CCCC Executive Committee.

On a motion from Dale Adams and a second from Bill Tanner, the vote to accept the name change from SRCE to TYCA, Southwest was unanimous, so for a while at least, the Southwest regional will be known as TYCA, Southwest/SRCE.

The Southwest regional is financially solvent with a preliminary balance of \$2,291.77 in its treasury, not yet counting the \$10 per member membership dues to be added. By the March CCCC meeting in Washington, D.C., the financial picture will be finalized.

Orlando, FL--November 17, 1994

SCETC held its Regional Executive Committee meeting in Atlanta, GA on October 1, 1994. At this time various issues were discussed pertaining to the regional and its activities:

1. Raised our membership dues to \$15 per calendar year beginning in 1996.
2. Continued to support and expand our Fund for Excellence by allocating annually: \$500 for the Cowan Award for Teaching Excellence, \$1500 for a research project proposed by a SCETC member, and conference registration funding for an adjunct instructor.

4. The 1995 SCETC conference will be held in Jacksonville, FL and is hosted by the Florida Community College at Jacksonville. The theme for the conference to be held at this riverfront city is "Full Literacy: Our Bridge to the Future." The conference is offering four pre-conference workshops on computer enhanced instruction, curriculum development for ESL, Paideia seminar methodologies, and cooperative learning in college classroom. There will be over 50 different individual sessions of professional, pedagogical interest, and special events such as annual luncheon, the Allyn and Bacon Riverboat Cruise and a post-conference tour to St. Augustine or Amelia Island.

Registration is \$70 for members (which includes the luncheon), and there are special rates for non-members and students.

5. Continued discussion of the transformation of SCETC to TYCA-Southeast and NTCC to TYCA.

NORTHEAST REGIONAL REPORT

Our annual conference was held in October, for the first time in Connecticut. Three colleges banded together as "The Connecticut Connection" and hosted a hugely successful conference--near record breaking attendance, exciting presentations, and Claire Bloom as the luncheon speaker.

A productive meeting of state representatives was held during the conference with plans for recruitment of new members and advance notice of the 1995 conference in New Hampshire.

Since 4C's is in Washington, D.C., the Executive Committee discussed its hosting of the Annual Two-Year College Breakfast. We're hoping we'll be TYCA by then so that we can celebrate the name change together.
