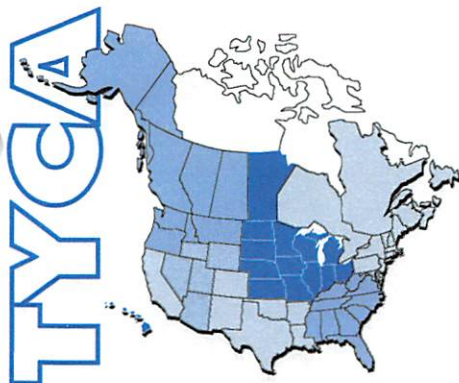

Greetings, Present and Past TYCA Leaders,

Forty-five years ago, in 1966, the first set of NCTE/CCCC sponsored two-year college regional conferences were held, and that series of conferences inspired a set of regional organizations, bound by the common interest of teaching in the two-year college and the common issues and challenges that face those who choose to teach in open admissions institutions with complex missions and diverse students.

Thirty years later, in 1996, National TYCA was born (after a rather difficult “labor”), an event many of you remember well, I’m sure; in fact, the national organization owes its existence to many of you. The creation of a national organization in addition to the already rich and vibrant regional organizations paved the way for two-year colleges to have representation and a voice in higher education leadership as well as a means to share our concerns and our innovations across regional boundaries.

For the first time, we who teach English at two-year colleges in the United States and Canada—along with everyone who cares deeply about the unique mission of two-year colleges—have our own national professional organization to give voice to our national and international concerns about our present and future roles in higher education.”

And will suffice.

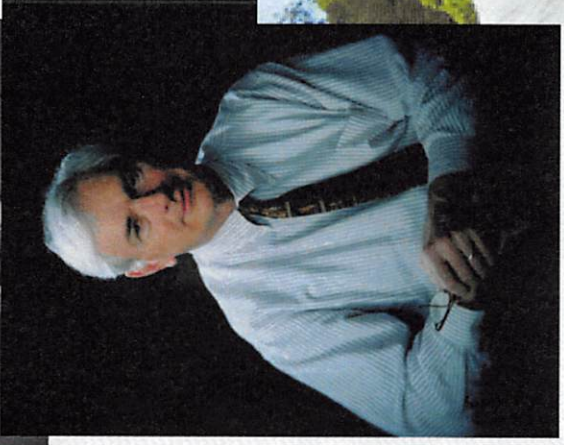

SUBJECT: TYCA Officer Visit to Regional Conferences 2011-12

As you are beginning to put together the program for your Regional Conference this year, we want to remind you of the responsibilities of both National TYCA and the TYCA Regionals for the TYCA Officer's visit to your regional conference.

These guidelines are meant to be suggestive rather than compulsory, except for the requirement to bring greetings and have a notice of NCTE association in the program:

National TYCA:

- Pays for travel of National TYCA Officer to attend the regional conference
- Asks National TYCA officer to bring greetings from National TYCA/NCTE, provides a workshop or session (when appropriate and desired), informs regional members about national issues and projects, and generally reinforces the regional-national relationship
- Provides kit of National TYCA/NCTE exhibit materials to be displayed at the conference

TYCA Regional:

- Provides booth space free of charge to the National TYCA/NCTE representative
- Helps offset costs, if possible, by covering the cost of the room and meals for the visiting officer. (NCTE will reimburse the regional for half the cost of the hotel room. See attached guidelines.)
- Clearly displays in the program that TYCA Regional is an association of NCTE
- Invites the National TYCA officer to bring greetings at a general session or meal function.

Visiting Officers:

You should communicate with them directly to better determine what role he/she might play in your conference.
